SENIOR PASTOR

STEPHEN OWEN

One of my favorite things to do as a church family is to observe the Lord's Supper. It is such a powerful time in which we are reminded of the immense sacrifice Christ made on our behalf to offer us salvation. We are invited to partake and join in that sacrifice as we are proclaiming His death and resurrection until He returns again. The Lord's supper is an act of surrender, an act of obedience, and an act of worship.

Another amazing aspect of the Lord's Supper is the call of unity it puts on all our hearts. I am reminded of 1 Corinthians 11, when Paul addressed issues of disunity as the church was trying to observe the Lord's Supper.

1 Corinthains 11:17-22 reads -

¹⁷ In the following directives I have no praise for you, for your meetings do more harm than good. ¹⁸ In the first place, I hear that when you come together as a church, there are divisions among you, and to some extent I believe it. ¹⁹ No doubt there have to be differences among you to show which of you have God's approval. ²⁰ So then, when you come together, it is not the Lord's Supper you eat, ²¹ for when you are eating, some of you go ahead with your own private suppers. As a result, one person remains hungry and another gets drunk. ²² Don't you have homes to eat and drink in? Or do you despise the church of God by humiliating those who have nothing? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you? Certainly not in this matter!

Paul reprimands the Corinthian church whose intention was to eat the Lord's Supper, but it was profaned by their gluttony, discrimination, and selfishness. The Lord's Supper should unify us by reminding us of our shared identity of being called by one Spirit, for the purpose of one hope, under one faith to be the one body of Christ. This unity transcends worldly differences and unites us in our common salvation through Jesus's sacrifice.

I want to invite you to experience this unity and celebration of Christ's sacrifice as we join together to observe the Lord's Supper together during our morning worship services on Sunday, October 12. I can't think of a better way to demonstrate the unity we have been studying about and put it into practice. Let us live out verse 33 that comes a few short lines later - So then, my brothers and sisters, when you gather to eat, you should all eat together. (NIV)

Let's celebrate the sacrifice of Christ that bonds us together! I hope you will join us!

One Year After Hurricane Helene: A Testament of Faith, Hope, and Service

September 27, 2025, marks one year since Hurricane Helene swept through Western North Carolina, bringing with it over 30 inches of relentless rainfall and leaving behind heartbreaking devastation. In the wake of this storm, entire communities were forever changed. Yet even in the face of overwhelming loss, light has shone brightly through the love, sacrifice, and resilience of volunteers and neighbors united by faith and compassion.

From the very beginning, thousands answered the call. Together, they prepared meals—over 500,000 through Baptist on Mission groups—cleared fallen trees, mucked out homes, tarped roofs, and carried supplies to the most remote and damaged corners of our mountains. They didn't stop at physical needs—volunteers also carried with them encouragement, prayer, and the spiritual nourishment that can sustain a weary soul.

Now, as we move from the **Recovery Phase** into the **Repair and Rebuild Phase**, the work continues. **Essential Rapid Repair/Rebuild (ERR) Teams** are still urgently needed, as are feeding teams who commit to a week at a time to provide meals for those working tirelessly in the field. This mission is not just about rebuilding houses, it is about rebuilding lives, renewing hope, and restoring faith.

To date, God has called forward and sent out through our ministry: 19 teams, 88 team members, and 1,369 volunteer hours faithfully given.

Ministries in Motion

- **Recovery Phase:** Chainsaw and debris removal, mucking out, roof tarping, feeding ministries, donor support and sorting, supply distribution, and spiritual nourishment.
- **Repair/Rebuild Phase:** Flooring, painting, sanding, sheetrock installation, cleaning, and—above all—spiritual encouragement.

Areas Served

Adaville, Asheboro (warehouse sorting), Asheville, Black Mountain, Blowing Rock, Boone, Burnsville, Chimney Rock, Creston, Green Mountain, Lake Lure, Lansing, North Wilkesboro, Old Fort, Spindale, Spruce Pine, Swannanoa, Wilkesboro and beyond, our teams have stood shoulder-to-shoulder with communities. Whether delivering supplies, serving meals, or lifting prayers, every action carried a message of hope: **you are not alone.**

Reflections from the Journey

Hurricane Helene reminded us how fragile our daily routines are and how swiftly life can be altered. Yet, through the rubble and the tears, we also witnessed something greater—the strength of faith, the power of community, and the resilience God places in the human spirit.

Volunteers came forward with the mindset: *No Power? No Problem*. Even without electricity, running water, or comfortable places to sleep, God provided. Each mission trip became more than a task list; it became a ministry of presence. There were hugs exchanged with quiet tears, prayers whispered in half-rebuilt homes, and Bibles placed gently in the hands of families as tangible reminders of God's unshakable love.

In the face of heartbreak, hope rose. In the shadow of loss, love shined. In the midst of devastation, encouragement flourished.

On our most recent trip, we left a verse for the family we served:

"For every house is built by someone, but God is the builder of everything."

—Hebrews 3:4

May we continue to be His hands and feet, building not only homes, but also hope, faith, love, and a renewed spirit across Western North Carolina.
